

PAST PAGES by Sue Ballew

When I was at the library researching for the "Past Pages" column for 100 years ago, I ran across this article and thought you might be interested. Josephine Roberts was one of two daughters raised in the Roberts House in Carson City. This is her story.

They called her Jo

Death has released Miss Jo Roberts from her suffering, a suffering which has extended over a period of two years, the lst year being particularly severe.

Miss Josephine Robrerts, the young daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Roberts, was born in this city and resided here until her death. She was one of the most popular young ladies in Carson City, and in fact, wherever she went she made friends that remained friends always.

At one time she was connected with the public schools of this city in the capacity of teacher but later she adopted the profession of stenography and filled many position of trust. When she was overtaken by illness, about two years ago, she had been stenographer for the late Governor Sparks, the position remaining hers until the death of the Governor.

With almost superhuman strength and will power she rallied from the first attack and her friends thought that she would recover entirely, but the hope was a vain one and the past year has been but a series of partial recoveries followed by the inevitable relapses.

Miss Roberts was an active member of the King's Daughters and many a sorrowing or suffering mortal can testify to her goodness of heart and charity of spirit. In the Leisure Hour club also she was one of the leading spirits, always ready to do her share of the work, whether it was literary in character or the more lowly work-a-day plans that had to be carried out.


In disposition she was always amiable, courteous and loveable and numbered her friends by the hundreds both in this city and in other places where she visited. She leaves to mourn her loss a loving father and mother, a devoted sister, Mrs. Ph McGrath, and a younger brother, Thurman, to all of whom the sympathy of the entire community is extended. 
