

# Mike Thomas to Speak on "George Washington, American Hero"



Mike Thomas will give a presentation titled "George Washington, American Hero" on Wednesday, Feb. 22 (Washington's birth date), from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., at the Carson City Library. The doors will open at 6:00

p.m. This slide-show lecture examines the life of the "Father of Our Country." It is the story of a gentleman farmer who stepped up and served his country when it needed him the most. You will see why his life demonstrates the true meaning of the phrase, "Duty, Honor, Country."

Mike Thomas is a popular lecturer who provides History & Science presentations in the Northern Nevada-Northern California region. He is the President of the Western Nevada Astronomical Society, which is the operating group for the Jack C. Davis Observatory at Western Nevada College. Mr. Thomas is known for his entertaining and educational programs.

### Victorian Fashion Show Sunday, March 11, 2012

Mark your calendars for Sunday, March 11, 3-6 p.m. to attend the third annual *Oh, My Bonnets* 

and Bustles! Fashion Show held at the Nevada State Museum. Tickets are \$30 and are at the Nevada State Museum store. Only 90 tickets will be sold in order to maximize the experience for attendees, so make sure to get yours soon! Proceeds will benefit the Friends of the Nevada State Museum and the Carson City Historical Society.



The event will highlight women's fashions from the 1850s through the early 20th century, roughly the same time period that Queen Victoria reigned in Britain -- hence the "Victorian" Era. The fashions for the event come from the collection

of Tina Davis-Hersey and Carolyn Davis. The collection includes original outfits as well as costumes created by the mother-daughter duo from historic patterns. The show will follow a series of vignettes of daily Victorian life, from dressing in the morning to dancing in the evening.

#### Carson City Research Group

The Carson City Research Group will meet on Saturday. Feb. 18, 2012, at 10:00 a.m. at the Carson City Library, 900 N. Roop St. They are also scheduled to meet March 17. The Research Group met on Saturday, Jan. 21, at White Cat Antiques, in the historic Smail House. The topic, "A Kid on the V&T," featured surprise guest speaker Bernie Allen, whose father worked on the Virginia & Truckee Railroad. Bernie described what Carson City was like in the 1950s, when a kid could ride on the V&T. He also talked about some of the buildings associated with the railroad and how some of the rolling stock ended up in the movies. The presentation concluded with a short guided tour of historic homes and locations on Curry St.

### Allen Rowe Gave Talk



Allen Rowe, a member of the professional Numismatics Guild and a

columnist for the Nevada Appeal, gave a presentation at the Carson Public Library on Thursday, Jan. 19, called "Numismatic Talk." Mr. Rowe is the owner of the Northern Nevada Coin stores, both here in Carson City (across from the Nevada State Museum) and in Reno on Plumb Lane. He talked about the history of coin making and circulation in the United States, about the various mints in the country (including Carson City's), and the types of coins minted here. Major portions of his talk centered on the factors that make certain coins more valuable than others
