# Jed Block To Do "Now and Then" Slideshow Thursday, May 17, 2012



Jed Block will present a slideshow/talk on Thursday, May 17, 2012, at 6:00 p.m. at the Carson City Library. The title of the talk is "Now and Then: a Pictorial Analysis of Carson City Changes." Mr.

Block has collected numerous pictures of Carson City's Carson Street and downtown area from earlier periods, such as the 1950s and 1960s, and compares them to recent photos of the same locations. These comparisons reveal a lot about the history of Carson City and the colorful people who shaped its future. The event is free and open to the public. It is presented by the Carson City Historical Society in cooperation with the Carson City Library.

Jed Block, a third generation Nevadan,was born and raised in Carson City, graduated from Carson High School, and has a BA in Communication from the University of the Pacific in Stockton, CA. Currently he sits on the Board of Equalization and the Historic Resources Commission, is Vice President of the Brewery Arts Center, and chairs the Redevelopment Authority Citizen Committee. He is very interested in Carson City History and would one day like to have a City Museum or a wing of the Nevada State Museum. His family owned business, State Agent and Transfer Syndicate, Inc., was formed here in Carson in 1903.

C.J. Birch Presents "Flintlock Rifles in Early America" Monday, June 11, 2012 C.J. Birch will present "Flintlock Rifles in Early America" at the Carson City Library on Monday, June 11, 2012, at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Birch makes reproductions of historical rifles. He will show and discuss his reproductions of flintlock rifles that have historic significance. Among these reproductions are the rifle given to George Washington when he retired from the presidency, the rifle that Edward Marshall used when he did the "Walking Purchase" of 1737 (claiming the land that is now Pennsylvania), Daniel Boone's gun, and the Lancaster rifle used by Natty Bumppo, the fictional hero of Last of the Mohicans. He will also display hunting bags and powder horns.



Mr. Birch is a former band director at Carson High School and has studied gun making with Jim

Chambers and Jim Klein. Although he is not a reenactor himself, he attends civil war reenactments. Several of his rifles reflect his Kentucky roots.

The event is free and open to the public. It is presented by the Carson City Historical Society in cooperation with the Carson City Library.

#### "Windows To Our Past" by Ronni Hannaman Exec. Dir. Carson City Chamber of Commerce

The Carson City Chamber of Commerce is in the process of producing a new oral history series entitled "Windows To Our Past" to serve as a companion piece to their popular *Carson City in Focus* magazine published bi-annually. Each issue of the magazine features history of the City that is themed to the content. Six issues have been produced to date.

The first oral history production featured those in our community who were instrumental in building our sports programs. Interviewed were Coach Ron McNutt, the highly successful baseball coach from Carson High School; Dr. Michael Fischer, the most influential voice in building the aquatic center: Assemblyman Pete Livermore, the father of Youth Sports; and Steve Kastens, former director of the Carson City Parks & Recreation Department who, during his tenure, carried out the will of the people who wanted sports fields built after the passage of the landmark Question 18 vote in 1996.

The oral history videos will be shown on Carson's local TV access channel ACCtv and will be available for viewing on their website. DVDs will be available for sale to benefit the Brewery Arts Center, as well. The second production centers on our arts community and the third centers on City Mayors.
