## July 2016 Newsy Letter

Dear Members and Friends,



The Carriage House has a working restroom as of July 20! That's progress! There's hope we can legally use the building in 2016. If you look at the picture, at left, you can see one of the new sets of blinds that was recently installed.

The **Board meeting** on July 11 didn't have a quorum - we need four Board members to make the quorum. But instead we had a good, general discussion. Topics included social events; Carriage House usage; obtaining our 501(c)(3) status from the IRS; the annual house and garden tour (changes needed to

HOWARD BENNETT finished the repairs on our Smith American pump organ. A little dowel had broken and caused the sound problems; HOWARD said it was a very good organ. We can be proud of this instrument and sincerely thank HOWARD for his 3-hour donation. Parlor organs such as this were once very popular. The organ pictured at right is similar to ours (photo credit: new.liveauctioneers.com). By 1870, after only 20 years of Smith American being in business, 30,000 of their organs were in use, as well as thousands by other parlor organ manufacturers. Many of these were elegantly decorated. By the end of the 19th century, the Smith American company changed its focus to piano production, but by the beginning of 20th century the
