Finally, Loretta promised the recipe for her combread pudding that was such a hit at the picnic. For those of you who asked the name of the recipe, Loretta reports that as far as she knows, it's just called "Combread Pudding". She first tasted it when her friend Kari made it. So, you can call it "Kari's Combread Pudding".

Kari's Cornbread Pudding 1 box of Jiffy Cornbread Mix 1 can of regular corn (15 oz) 1 can of creamed corn (15 oz) 1 cube of butter (melted) 1 16 oz sour cream 1 cup of grated cheddar cheese

Mix all together (EXCEPT FOR THE CHEESE) and pour into a baking dish. Bake in a 350 degrees oven for 45 minutes. Then remove from oven and then sprinkle the cheese over the top and return to the oven and bake until cheese melts (about 10 minutes). This is not a desert, but a "side dish."

For the larger crowd, double the recipe and it will make a little more than will fit in a  $9 \times 13$  baking dish.
