CCHS Accomplishments 2022

We've come a long way since COVID. We're still not out of the woods. But, we are getting to know each other again, making progress with projects and programs, and we've doubled our membership. The future is looking good. Here are a few of our accomplishments:

- Even though we were unable to meet for a long time, CCHS Secretary David Bugli set up Zoom lectures on all kinds of local history. These were extremely popular, educational, and fascinating. Starting in January 2023, we will start to provide lectures that are in person, and David is hoping to add a Zoom feature for members who live far away or are unable to attend in person.
- "If These Gowns Could Talk" was a Victorian dress display, including Celtic entertainment by Kat MacMartin and a visit by Mayor Bagwell, the Daughters of the American Revolution, and many others. Loretta Williams, one of our members, made some of the dresses. Costumes were borrowed from Andi Fant, Andrea Hobbs, and Marge Dolan, and were displayed by Kat Long. Andrea Hobbs did all the labels and wall displays and provided art expertise. Jan Loverin loaned us dress forms from the Textile Museum and provided books and ideas on the proper way to display dresses. (In May 2023 we are having a display of Edwardian fashions.)
- Our exhibits in the Carriage House, "Notable Women of Eagle Valley," "Nevada State Orphans Home," and "Hats from the '30s and '40s," were on display (and still are). Andrea Hobbs did the design and display for all of these.
- We received a grant from Travel Nevada to help pay for entertainment, publicity, and printing for our many events for this fiscal year.
- A "Downton Abbey Tea," with catering by "A Catered Affair," was a great success. Becca Van Sickle did a Victorian presentation on how women dressed during the 1800s.
- In April 2022 we received an email from former Carson City resident Diane Bertrum wanting to know if we were interested in her 50-year-old Music Box/Adele's dollhouse. It was a gift to her and still in the box. She donated the Adele's dollhouse to the Society. Woodworking Specialties painted and added all the fancy woodwork to it, and we had a Great Reveal with many people who had worked in Adele's and with Charlie Abowd, who shared stories with everyone. It was amazing.
- We are finishing up 2022 with our Annual Christmas Party. I hope you can come! And we're starting up our Home Tours again with one on Saturday, December 10. In addition, there will be a Garden Tour in the spring!
- This year we had Kim Harris do a Chautauqua presentation. She researched and portrayed Annie Roberts, matriarch of the Roberts family. We had a "picnic" in the Carriage House with lunch and dessert from "A Catered Affair." Annie's life history had never been fully researched. Kim's portrayal was phenomenal.
- Each of our Board members have participated and helped make these events successful. A lot goes on between the scenes: maintaining facilities, shopping, being there when we need help (Donna McLaren); paying bills and keeping track of payments (Kiyoshi Nishikawa); running the Downtown Vintage Market (from which we receive a percentage of sales) and maintaining our Arlo security system (Travis Legatzke); and providing flowers, decorating for tours, rearranging offices, moving chairs, and setting up tables (Liz Cain).
- Three of our non-Board members have gone the extra 100 miles helping to make events happen, calling, helping with newsletters, taking guests on tours of the house, and choosing photos for the Children's Home display in the Carriage House. They are Noni Hayes, Paula Cannon, and Bonnie Nishikawa.
- The Downtown Vintage Market was new this summer and fall and was set up through the Hop and May Adams Foundation. CCHS receives a percentage of the profits from these weekly events. This also gave CCHS Board members an opportunity to share Carson City history. The market was set up and run by Travis Legatzke.
- Ubon Edwards, artist, currently has her artwork on display in the Community Center. She is also a new volunteer docent and joins us on Sundays at the Foreman-Roberts House to give tours.
- Kudos to Chris Pattison, our membership chairperson, for setting up Mail Chimp mailings, maintaining membership, setting up Square and to Pam Abercrombie for taking this task on now and in the new year.

Our Adele's Dollhouse reveal was very successful on both Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 5 and 6. On Sunday Charlie Abowd and his family and restaurant workers came.
