CCHS received an email earlier this week from a lady who had a Corbett-Fitzsimmons souvenir. It is about 1.5" wide and 2.5" long and depicts the famous fight that took place in Carson City on St. Patrick's Day of 1897 at the racetrack. (There is a monument at the Sheriff's office). This fight was

significant in our history, as fights were frowned upon anywhere. A woman, Nellie Mighels Davis, reported on the fight for a Chicago paper. It is significant because women weren't allowed at fights. People climbed trees to get a good look at the match, and it was one of the first films made.
