Due to overwhelming demand, the Carson City Historical Society, in partnership with the Brewery Arts Center, is pleased to present an encore of Jed Block's captivating lecture, *Carson City: Then & Now.* This special event will take place on Sunday, April 27, 2025, at 1:00 p.m. in the Grand Ballroom of the Brewery Arts Center, located at 449 W. King St., Carson City.

A Carson City native and devoted historian, Block has spent over two decades researching and documenting the city's rich past. Renowned for his expertise in the Capital City's history, he brings its stories to life, inspiring a deeper appreciation for historic preservation. His extensive collection of historic photographs and meticulous research have made *Carson City: Then & Now* a local favorite, offering a fascinating look at the city's lost landmarks and evolving landscape.

Block's passion for history began more than 20 years ago while researching a redevelopment project, igniting a lifelong dedication to preserving and sharing Carson City's heritage. He currently serves on the Carson City Historic Resources Commission, where he previously held the role of Chairman, and continues to advocate for the protection of the city's historical treasures
